

Request for Proposal (RFP): Catalyst Projects

- We finally(!) launched our Catalyst Pre-development Funds
 Request for Proposal—thanks everyone for bearing with us!
- RRRISE's Catalyst Fund will invest \$9 million in pre-development activities to prepare projects in the Redwood Region that are aligned with RRRISE's values and Regional Roadmap strategies.
- Application Deadline: Wednesday, January 15, 2025, at 5:00 p.m.
- **Electronic form, fillable PDF, and hard copy submissions** are all accepted. Hard copies should be sent to CCRP.
- Applicants will be asked to complete a voluntary Pre-Application Questionnaire.



Request for Proposal (RFP): Catalyst Projects Types of projects sought

- \rightarrow Pre development stage projects: this may be exploratory or last mile (see RFP page 5)
 - Innovation & Value Chain Infrastructure: Projects address gaps in an industry that create barriers to growth, thriving jobs, and equity.
 - Entrepreneurship and Access to Capital: Projects that help small businesses grow to the next level of success.
 - Social Infrastructure: Projects that remove barriers and support access to economic and workforce opportunities for communities historically excluded from economic well-being and opportunity, and economic development decision-making.
 - Workforce Development: Projects that support workforce training and/or supportive services that help workers access good jobs.

Request for Proposal (RFP): Application Process



- Applicants will answer project narrative questions on:
 - A description of the project
 - How success will be measured
 - Who will benefit from the project
 - Description of a work plan
 - Risks and barriers to the project
 - How the project will center equity
 - Connection between project and RRRISE goals (if not addressed previously)
- The application will require a Budget, Budget Narrative, and a list of Project Team Leads as PDF attachments. Applicants can submit an **optional** work/business plan.

Request for Proposal (RFP): Scoring Elements

Alignment with Sectors:

Projects that fall in one of the RRRISE industry sectors will be evaluated and scored based on their alignment with the sector's strategies.

Balanced Investments:

The RRRISE Voting Block will strive to approve a portfolio of projects that balance:

- Industry sectors
- Geographies (regional, Tribal Lands, and county-level)
- Pre-development stages of readiness (exploratory and last-mile)



Request for Proposal (RFP): Scoring Elements (2)

- Alignment with funding priority areas, including:
 - Projects that include substantial or direct participation from industry leaders and employers in industry sectors
 - Projects that build capacity for organizations that serve priority communities, organizations that are led by priority communities, and that substantially benefit priority communities
- Projects that are led by a Tribal Nation (whether federally recognized or not), Tribal-led and serving organizations, and/or consortiums of Tribes whose ancestral and present-day lands are in the Redwood Region.



Request for Proposal (RFP): Scoring Rubric



ightarrow Catalyst applicants will be evaluated using a Scoring Rubric developed by the Equity Council and Voting Members:

1. Feasibility and Budget Criteria:

- Verifies project location, allowable uses of funds, and partner capabilities
- Ensures complete proposal with key components
- Requires budget detail and feasible financial projections

2. Scored Evaluation Criteria (0-4 points):

- **Equity:** Focuses on benefiting and empowering priority communities
- Economic Development: Creates living wage jobs, career pathways
- Environmental: Minimizes pollution, supports climate goals
- **Extra Point Opportunities:** Priority community leadership, partnerships, landscape and ecosystem health, drive innovation, advance multiple regional priorities, promote entrepreneurship, improve regional resilience

Request for Proposal (RFP): Award Selection



A committee of up to 30 Project Scorers will be recruited across the Collaborative

Each application will be scored by at least three independent Scorers

• The 20 highest scoring applications will be sent to the Voting Member Block

- Finalists will be invited to participate in a short pitch session with Voting Members
- Final decisions will be made after the RISE in-person Collaborative Meeting in the first quarter of 2025

Request for Proposal (RFP): Call for Project Scorers!

- → Redwood Region RISE is looking for <u>up to 30 Project Scorers</u> that will evaluate Catalyst proposals
 - Regionally balanced group of Project Scorers
 - Representation from priority communities
 - Aligned with RRRISE Conflict of Interest policy
- → Project Scorers will receive \$1500 for their work and receive training and technical support throughout.



Regional Plan Part 2 (regional strategies):


- The State is using these to create a "State Blueprint 2025-2035"

Sector Investment Coordinators (2)

- Current priorities of the Sector Investment Coordinators:
 - Developing Activation Plans
 - Reconvening sector tables



Sector Investment Coordinators: Introducing Activation Plans



- Objective: Ensure we have the steps in place to achieve our proposed strategies, from building funding stacks to developing critical partnerships to identifying and creating plans to address regulatory barriers.
- One <u>draft</u> Activation Plan due on January 31, 2025 to the State:
 - Strategy: What are the key strategic initiatives that will help the region advance the selected sector (e.g., ensure a more accessible and sustainable talent pipeline)?
 - Tactic: What primary steps will the Collaborative and its partners take over the next 12-18 months to achieve the region's sector strategy (e.g., build an industry-workforce partnership)?
 - Tasks: What specific actions are individuals or organizations responsible for, and by when (e.g., [organization] will conduct outreach to five [5] community colleges and workforce training programs by [date])? Tasks may include new projects or refocusing existing programs, as well as day-to-day activities of different organizations.

Sector Investment Coordinators: Introducing Activation Plans (2)

- Activation Plans will be built off of the strategies outlined in RRRISE Regional Plan Part 2.
- Project Initiators can engage in this process through:
 - Sector Table Meetings convened by Sector Investment Coordinators:
 - Arts, Culture, and Tourism
 - Health and Caregiving
 - Renewable and Resilient Energy
 - Working Lands and Blue Economy
