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Background

Building Healthy Communities (BHC) is an initiative of The California Endowment (TCE). The goal of BHC is to "support the development of communities where kids and youth are healthy, safe and ready to learn." Del Norte County and adjacent Tribal lands is one of the fourteen places embarking on this ten-year initiative with TCE. As part of the planning process, the California Center for Rural Policy (CCRP) prepared this report of past and current educational achievement data for Del Norte County.

Methods and Organization of Report

The data presented in this report was obtained from several sources. The majority of the data was from the California Department of Education website (http://dq.cde.ca.gov/dataquest/). Additional data sources are noted throughout the report. Data was entered into Microsoft Excel and graphs were created. Trends are presented whenever possible. Data is presented from the macro to micro level- from the county to school level. School level data is presented from Elementary to Middle to High School. Charter school data is presented at the end of the report. Data is not presented when there are fewer than 10 students. Many of the charter schools have limited data due to a small number of students, so as much data as possible is presented. Pacific View is a charter school located in Del Norte, but charted by the Humboldt County Office of Education. Data for Pacific View is not available separate from the primary location in Loleta, and therefore is not presented in this report.

This report is intended to be a "living document" with new data being added as it becomes available. Del Norte County Unified School District and Office of Education are currently working with First 5 Del Norte to select a readiness assessment system for pre-kindergarten. Data from these assessments will be included when available.

Importance of Educational Achievement


Studies have shown a positive association between education level and overall health.¹⁻³ Indeed, education level may be the strongest and most consistent predictor of good health, rather than income or occupation.¹ Lower levels of education have been associated with high blood pressure, smoking, high cholesterol, and shorter life expectancy.^{1,4} Compared to less educated individuals, those with more education are less likely to report fair/poor health and more likely to engage in healthy behaviors such as exercise, healthy eating, maintaining a healthy body weight, and abstaining from tobacco use.^{3,5}

There is an increasing body of literature showing that early childhood is an important period for influencing future health and development. Reading to young children is important for cognitive development. Researchers Children who are read to tend to have higher scores in vocabulary and listening comprehension. Researchers found that mothers from low and middle-class households who read to their infants or toddlers resulted in literacy skills above the national average at three years of age. Students who don't read proficiently by third grade are four times more likely to not graduate from high school compared to proficient readers. Adolescents with low literacy skills are more likely to be a victim or perpetrator of violence than adolescents with age appropriate reading levels.

Attendance in preschool has been associated with positive health outcomes including, less risk of overweight/obesity, improved mental health and social competence, and decreased crime later in life.^{6,11} Children who attend Head Start or preschool are more likely to complete high school and less likely to require special education classes. Attendance in Head Start has been shown to improve cognitive, verbal and social ability among socially disadvantaged children.¹² Children who attend preschool are better able to develop a sense of autonomy. Being around other children, allows them to differentiate themselves from their peers and become aware of their own likes and dislikes.¹³ Additionally, children in preschool learn to express emotion and suppress emotion at socially acceptable times, which promotes successful social interactions between peers and authority figures.¹¹



Exhibit 3. Del Norte County: Highest Level of Educational Attainment, 2005-2009






Exhibit 4. Del Norte County: Median Annual Income by Highest Level of Educational Attainment

Exhibit 5. Del Norte County: Percent of Children *Not* Attending Preschool, Nursery School or Head Start at Least 10 Hours per Week



Exhibit 6. Del Norte County: Percent of Parents Reading to their Children (0-5) Daily





Exhibit 7. Del Norte County: Race/Ethnicity of all Elementary, Middle and High School Students, 2008-2009





Exhibit 9. Del Norte County: Percent of Students Eligible for Free/Reduced Price Lunch, but *Not* Participating in the Program







Exhibit 12. Del Norte County: Percent of Students Grades 2-11 with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the Math Section of the STAR Test





Exhibit 13. Del Norte County: Percent of Students Grades 2-11 with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the Science Section of the STAR Test

Exhibit 14. Del Norte County: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the English-Language Arts Section of the California High School Exit Exam






Exhibit 15. Del Norte County: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the Math Section of the California High School Exit Exam


Exhibit 16. Del Norte County: Average High School Graduation Rates



Exhibit 17. Del Norte County: Percent of High School Graduates with UC/CSU Required Courses





Exhibit 20. Del Norte County: High School 4-Year Drop Out Rate





Exhibit 21. Del Norte County: High School 4-Year Drop Out Rate by Race/Ethnicity



Exhibit 22. Del Norte County: Truancy Rates*





Exhibit 23. Del Norte County School District: School Absence Rates by Grade, 2009-2010









Exhibit 26. Bess Maxwell Elementary: Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 27. Bess Maxwell Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 28. Bess Maxwell Elementary: Parent Education Level*






Exhibit 31. Bess Maxwell Elementary: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with At Risk Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 32. Joe Hamilton Elementary: Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 33. Joe Hamilton Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 34. Joe Hamilton Elementary: Parent Education Level*







Exhibit 37. Joe Hamilton Elementary: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance 2009-2010


Percent of Students with At Risk Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 38. Margaret Keating Elementary: Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 39. Margaret Keating Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 40. Margaret Keating Elementary: Parent Education Level*






Exhibit 42. Margaret Keating Elementary: Truancy Rates*





Exhibit 43. Margaret Keating Elementary: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance, 2009-2010

Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 44. Mary Peacock Elementary: Race/Ethnicity 2008-2009





Exhibit 45. Mary Peacock Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 46. Mary Peacock Elementary: Parent Education Level*











Exhibit 50. Mountain Elementary: Race/Ethnicity 2008-2009





Exhibit 51. Mountain Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 52. Mountain Elementary: Parent Education Level*





Exhibit 54. Mountain Elementary: Truancy Rates*







Exhibit 55. Mountain Elementary: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance 2009-2010

Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 56. Pine Grove Elementary: Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 57. Pine Grove Elementary: Students Enrolled in Free or Reduced Price Meals





Exhibit 58. Pine Grove Elementary: Parent Education Level*








Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010



Exhibit 64. Redwood Elementary: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 65. Redwood Elementary: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test





Exhibit 66. Redwood Elementary: Truancy Rates*



Exhibit 67. Redwood Elementary: Absence Rates






Percent of Students with At Risk Absence 2009-2010

Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 70. Smith River Elementary: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 71. Smith River Elementary: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test






Exhibit 72. Smith River Elementary: Truancy Rates*


Exhibit 73. Smith River Elementary: Absence Rates

Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance 2009-2010




Percent of Students with At Risk Absence 2009-2010

Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010







Exhibit 76. Crescent Elk Middle School: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 77. Crescent Elk Middle School: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test





Exhibit 78. Crescent Elk Middle School: Truancy Rates*



Exhibit 79. Crescent Elk Middle School: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance 2009-2010


Percent of Students with At Risk Attendance 2009-2010





Exhibit 81. Crescent Elk Middle School: Expulsion/Suspension Rates due to Violence/Drugs*





Exhibit 84. Del Norte High School: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 85. Del Norte High School: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test





Exhibit 86. Del Norte High School: College of the Redwoods English and Math Placement Levels of High School Graduates

Exhibit 87. Del Norte High School: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the English-Language Arts Section of the California High School Exit Exam






Exhibit 88. Del Norte High School: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the Math Section of the California High School Exit Exam





Exhibit 89. Del Norte High School: Absence Rates


Percent of Students with Satisfactory Attendance 2009-2010



Percent of Students with At Risk Absence 2009-2010




Percent of Students with Chronic and Severe Chronic Absence 2009-2010





Exhibit 90. Del Norte High School: Truancy Rates*





Exhibit 92. Del Norte High School: Expulsion/Suspension Rates due to Violence/Drugs*





Exhibit 95. Sunset High School: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 96. Sunset High School: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test






Exhibit 97. Sunset High School: College of the Redwoods English and Math Placement Levels of High School Graduates




Exhibit 99. Sunset High School: Truancy Rates*







Exhibit 104. Castle Rock: Parent Education Level*




Exhibit 105. Castle Rock: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test






Exhibit 106. Castle Rock: College of the Redwoods English and Math Placement Levels of High School Graduates

Exhibit 108. Castle Rock: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the English-Language Arts Section of the California High School Exit Exam





Exhibit 109. Castle Rock: Percent of 10th Grade Students Passing the Math Section of the California High School Exit Exam





Exhibit 112. Klamath River Early College of the Redwoods: Parent Education Level*





Exhibit 113. Klamath River Early College of the Redwoods: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test







Exhibit 116. Unchartered Shores Academy, Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 118. Unchartered Shores Academy Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test





Exhibit 119. Bar-O Boys School: Race/Ethnicity, 2008-2009





Exhibit 121. Bar-O Boys School: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test





Exhibit 124. McCarthy Community School: Parent Education Level*





Exhibit 125. McCarthy Community School: Percent of Students with Proficient or Advanced Scores on the STAR Test



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
