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# Del Norte County: A Look at Educational Achievement

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## Background

Building Healthy Communities (BHC) is an initiative of The California Endowment (TCE). The goal of BHC is to "support the development of communities where kids and youth are healthy, safe and ready to learn." Del Norte County and adjacent Tribal lands is one of the fourteen places embarking on this ten-year initiative with TCE. As part of the planning process, the California Center for Rural Policy (CCRP) prepared this report of past and current educational achievement data for Del Norte County.

## Methods and Organization of Report

The data presented in this report was obtained from several sources. The majority of the data was from the California Department of Education website (http://dq.cde.ca.gov/dataquest/). Additional data sources are noted throughout the report. Data was entered into Microsoft Excel and graphs were created. Trends are presented whenever possible. Data is presented from the macro to micro level- from the county to school level. School level data is presented from Elementary to Middle to High School. Charter school data is presented at the end of the report. Data is not presented when there are fewer than 10 students. Many of the charter schools have limited data due to a small number of students, so as much data as possible is presented. Pacific View is a charter school located in Del Norte, but charted by the Humboldt County Office of Education. Data for Pacific View is not available separate from the primary location in Loleta, and therefore is not presented in this report.

This report is intended to be a "living document" with new data being added as it becomes available. Del Norte County Unified School District and Office of Education are currently working with First 5 Del Norte to select a readiness assessment system for pre-kindergarten. Data from these assessments will be included when available.

## Importance of Educational Achievement

Studies have shown a positive association between education level and overall health. ${ }^{1-3}$ Indeed, education level may be the strongest and most consistent predictor of good health, rather than income or occupation. ${ }^{1}$ Lower levels of education have been associated with high blood pressure, smoking, high cholesterol, and shorter life expectancy. ${ }^{1,4}$ Compared to less educated individuals, those with more education are less likely to report fair/poor health and more likely to engage in healthy behaviors such as exercise, healthy eating, maintaining a healthy body weight, and abstaining from tobacco use. ${ }^{3,5}$

There is an increasing body of literature showing that early childhood is an important period for influencing future health and development. ${ }^{6}$ Reading to young children is important for cognitive development. ${ }^{7,8}$ Children who are read to tend to have higher scores in vocabulary and listening comprehension. Researchers found that mothers from low and middle-class households who read to their infants or toddlers resulted in literacy skills above the national average at three years of age. ${ }^{8}$ Students who don't read proficiently by third grade are four times more likely to not graduate from high school compared to proficient readers. ${ }^{9}$ Adolescents with low literacy skills are more likely to be a victim or perpetrator of violence than adolescents with age appropriate reading levels. ${ }^{10}$

Attendance in preschool has been associated with positive health outcomes including, less risk of overweight/obesity, improved mental health and social competence, and decreased crime later in life. ${ }^{6,11}$ Children who attend Head Start or preschool are more likely to complete high school and less likely to require special education classes. Attendance in Head Start has been shown to improve cognitive, verbal and social ability among socially disadvantaged children. ${ }^{12}$ Children who attend preschool are better able to develop a sense of autonomy. Being around other children, allows them to differentiate themselves from their peers and become aware of their own likes and dislikes. ${ }^{13}$ Additionally, children in preschool learn to express emotion and suppress emotion at socially acceptable times, which promotes successful social interactions between peers and authority figures. ${ }^{11}$
