




#1 Reason: Lack of Health Care Providers

Quotes from Del Norte County Respondents

- "Needed mental health care when it is essentially unavailable in this community."
- "Not enough doctors to see everyone."
- "I don't know who to see and I don't have \$"
- "No doctors or dentists available for new patients in Del Norte who take CMSP"
- "No doctors available or willing to take new patients or Medi-Cal"
- "I am on Medi-Cal due to not working. Del Norte has lost several doctors and most doctors don't take Medi-Cal. I finally got into a doctor here after an 18 month wait."
- "Too expensive, inadequate benefits, no transportation, and generally unavailable."





During the past 12 months did you visit a hospital emergency room for your own health?






Del Norte County: No Health Insurance by Poverty Level (age 18-64) (n = 270)






Del Norte County: Use of ER for Health Care in Past Year by Income Status (n = 354)





Del Norte County: Use of ER for Health Care in Past Year by Insurance Status (n = 352)






Leaving County for Health Services

Do you regularly go outside your county for health services?




Regularly Leave County for Health Services (n = 2,918)






Del Norte: Reasons for Regularly Leaving County for Health Services (n = 185)*






Del Norte: Types of Needed Services Not Available $(n = 99)^*$





Del Norte: Specialty Care Regularly Sought Outside the County $(n = 59)^*$




Del Norte County: Meeting Recommendations* for Moderate or Vigorous Activity by Income Status (n = 352)




Del Norte County: Daily Cigarette Smoking by Income Status (n = 354)






Del Norte County: Teeth Cleaned in Past 2 Years by Income Status (n = 299)






Del Norte County: Mammogram in Past 2 years by Income Status (women age 40-64) (n = 130)






Del Norte County: Recommended Colorectal Cancer Screening* by Income Status (age 50-64) (n = 149)





Del Norte County: Pap Test in Past 5 Years by Income Status (women age 18-64) (n = 163)






Very Low Food Security by County of Residence (n = 2,906)




Del Norte County: Very Low Food Security by Poverty Level of Respondent (n = 351)






Del Norte County: Very Low Food Security by Households with Children Under 18 (n = 414)

Study Methods: The Rural Health Information Survey (RHIS) was conducted by the California Center for Rural Policy in the fall of 2006. A total of 23,606 surveys were mailed to a random sample of post office box holders in the four counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Trinity and Mendocino. The total number of returned surveys was 3,003 for an overall response rate of 12.7%. 




Del Norte County: Transportation as a Problem Meeting Health Needs (n = 171)
