- The average age of a homeless person in the United States is 9 years old.



HOMLESSNESS & DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

128 Respondents Experienced Domestic Violence In Their Lifetime

45 respondents were actively fleeing domestic violence

RESPONDENT CITED FACTORS:

- ASK GOD
- I GAVE UP A LONG TIME AGO
- NOBODY WILL HELP ME
- I HAVE BAD CREDIT
- WE BOTH WORK BUT CAN'T FIND AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- MY DRIVERS LICENSE WAS STOLEN AND I CAN'T GET ANYTHING NOW
- I CAN'T STOP DRINKING
- I AM HAPPY DOING WHAT I AM DOING
- I DO NOT READ OR WRITE

RESPONDENT CITED FACTORS 2:

- MY PARENTS DIED AND I HAVE NO WHERE TO LIVE
- I AM NOT HOMELESS I SHOULD HAVE SQUATTER RIGHTS
- MY KIDS ARE IN PRISON AND I AM RAISING MY GRANDCHILDREN
- GOT KICKED OUT OF MY APARTMENT FOR TOO MANY PEOPLE LIVING THERE
- I AM AFRAID OUT HERE
- LOST HOUSING VOUCHER BECAUSE I WENT TO JAIL
- NO RENTALS
- BEEN ON A WAITING LIST FOR 2 YEARS

RESPONDENT CITED FACTORS 3:

- I JUST GOT OUT OF JAIL AND NO ONE WILL GIVE ME A CHANCE
- PERSONAL CHOICE (VERY FEW)
- TURNED DOWN FOR DISABILITY
- BECAUSE NO ONE TRUSTS ME
- AVOIDING CONFLICT, NOISE OR CHAOS (DOMESTIC VIOLENCE)
- AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- DRUGS
- I HAVE PTSD (MANY DV CLIENTS SAID THIS)
