

REDWOOD REGION RISE (RRRISE) CERF FACT SHEET

First things first: What is CERF?

The Community Economic Resilience Fund (CERF) is a state-wide program to promote a sustainable and equitable recovery from the economic distress of COVID-19. CERF will distribute \$600 million across 13 regions to support inclusive planning and implementation of projects to create accessible, high-quality jobs in sustainable industries as the state transitions to a carbon neutral economy.

And what is Redwood Region RISE?

Redwood Region RISE (Resilient Inclusive Sustainable Economy) is the name of our Region's CERF initiative, which includes Del Norte, Humboldt, Lake, Mendocino Counties, and Tribal Lands. Our Region's High Road Transition Collaborative (HRTC) is a broad community coalition of around 520 members (and counting!). The HRTC will work together to select projects that support long-term economic and climate resilience in our Region by promoting economic diversification, sustainability, and equity.



How is the CERF initiative structured?

1. Planning Phase

Each of CA's 13 regions receives ~\$5M to create an HRTC to lead an inclusive, diverse, and accountable regional planning process resulting in a regional strategy and recommended investments to grow sustainable industries, diversify regional economies, and increase access to high-quality jobs.

2. Implementation Phase

The State will release rolling competitive grants between winter 2022 – autumn 2026 to fund projects put forward by each Region's HRTC. Criteria such as demonstrated community support, alignment with climate goals, adherence to labor standards, and access to high-quality jobs with clear employment pathways for underserved and incumbent workers are required elements of project applications.


