FACT SHEET: REDWOOD REGION RISE (RRRISE) CALIFORNIA JOBS FIRST

What is California Jobs First?

California Jobs First (formerly "CERF") is a state-wide program designed to promote a sustainable and equitable recovery from the economic distress of COVID-19. CA Jobs First will distribute \$600 million across 13 regions to support the planning and implementation efforts of strategies and projects that prioritize the creation of accessible, high-quality jobs in sustainable industries.

And what is Redwood Region RISE?

Redwood Region RISE (Resilient Inclusive Sustainable Economy) is the name of our Region's initiative, which includes Del Norte, Humboldt, Lake, Mendocino Counties, and Tribal Lands. Our Region's Collaborative is a broad and diverse community coalition of around 650 members (and counting!). Our Collaborative will work together to select projects that aim to support economic resilience and transition for the Region, while promoting economic diversification, sustainability, and equity.



How is the CA Jobs First initiative structured?

1. Planning Phase: Each region receives ~\$5M to create an inclusive and accountable regional planning process that results in a holistic strategy and recommended series of investments: A Regional Economic Plan.

2. Catalyst Program: The Catalyst Program allocates up to \$14 million for each of the 13 Regions to bridge the gap between the Planning Phase and the Implementation Phase.
3. Implementation Phase: The State provides ~\$500M in rolling, semi-competitive grants to fund projects put forward by the Region's Collaboratives. Criteria such as demonstrated community support, alignment with climate goals, demonstration of labor standards, and high-quality jobs with clear employment pathways for underserved and incumbent workers will be evaluated.


Meet the RRRISE Convener Team
